Plan your 2015 Professional Development Now

In 2015, CAUDIT will deliver two key professional development activities. These two events are driven by member institution needs to enable them to grow and build staffing capabilities. The programs capture team leaders and managers by way of the CAUDIT Managers Program, and senior managers aspiring to the CIO role in the CAUDIT Leadership Institute.

CAUDIT Leadership Institute (CLI)

About: The CLI is a one week dynamic, immersive program designed to enhance the leadership skills of Australian and New Zealand information technology and information resources managers in higher education. It is an outstanding opportunity to share information with peers and participate in hands-on learning experiences.

Members of the CAUDIT Leadership Institute faculty are senior information technology and information resources professionals in higher education, drawn from Australia, New Zealand, and the United States. The Institute has been offered annually since 1998. Placements are capped at 48.

When: 17 – 21 August. Applications will open around April 2015 and will be announced via this newsletter. The cost is approximately \$5000 (not including travel).

CAUDIT Managers Program

About: The CAUDIT Program for Managers offers training and coaching modules including 360-degree feedback using the LSI model (Leadership Skills Inventory). Modules are delivered at host universities, with time allocated for a tour and discussion with IT leaders at the university.

The program is delivered over 7-8 months as four face-to-face workshops with assignments and one on one coaching between modules. CAUDIT engages external training facilitators for this program.

CAUDIT Director, Strategic Procurement, Steve Johnston has advised that November saw discussions with Dimension Data, AWS and Tableau take place and that those universities whose Microsoft Agreements were due for renewal in November have been busy finalising their choice of model and liaising with their university's legal office. Telecommunications (Interception and Access) Amendment (Data Retention) Bill

Members may be interested in the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Intelligence and Security inquiry into the Government's planned Telecommunications (Interception and Access) Amendment (Data Retention) Bill.

The bill seeks to implement a mandatory telecommunications data retention regime. It contains measures to require telecommunications suppliers in Australia to retain certain data for two years. The potential impact of this on universities is, as yet, unknown.
